Bangladesh is committed to uphold the principles outlined in the United Nations Charter, promoting the peaceful resolution of international conflicts and maintaining global peace and security. Bangladesh is a peace-loving country. Maintaining friendship with all countries is enshrined in the constitution of Bangladesh which is reflected in our foreign policy. Shaheed President Ziaur Rahman adopted a balanced position in foreign policy, which increased Bangladesh's acceptability in the United Nations. During his time, Bangladesh stood in favour of international peace and cooperation. Because of his active diplomacy, Bangladesh has been rendering a very important contribution as one of the largest troops contributing countries to United Nations peacekeeping operations. On its quest to establish world peace, Bangladesh has already made enormous contribution under the auspices of Blue Helmet. Steadfast to this policy, Bangladesh Armed Forces and Bangladesh Police have globally been engaged in the United Nations Peacekeeping Operations for the last 38 years. To commemorate their glorious participation, every year 29 May is observed as the International Day of United Nations Peacekeepers. However, as per the official government calendar for 2026, the Eid-ul-Azha holidays has continued up to 31 May 2026. Hence, the International Day of UN Peacekeepers- 2026 is being celebrated on 10 June 2026 instead of 29 May 2026 in this year only. Theme for this year's International peacekeepers Day is "Invest in Peace."

Bangladesh embarked on its participation in UN peacekeeping missions in 1988 by initially sending 15 military observers from its Army to the Iran-Iraq Military Observer Group. This was followed by the deployment of Bangladeshi police personnel to Namibia in 1989. Bangladesh Navy joined peacekeeping efforts in Mozambique in 1993, while Bangladesh Air Force began its involvement in Bosnia-Herzegovina the same year, marking the nation's expanding role in global peace operations. From Haiti to East Timor and Lebanon to Congo, the peacekeepers of Bangladesh have left their footprints in almost every place across the conflict areas. They carried out their duties amidst the shivering cold of Bosnia, the scorching heat of the Sahara Desert and the dull humid weather of East Asia. Leaving behind all differences of religion, creed and cast, Bangladeshi peacekeepers risk their life in serving global humanity. Today, they have earned the time-honored credentials of a 'Role Model in global peacekeeping by dint of proven professionalism, impartiality, integrity and humane attitude in their approach.

With all-out support from the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the country now stands as one of the world's foremost contributors of military and police personnel to global peacekeeping efforts. To date, a total of 2,06,476 Bangladeshi peacekeepers have served in 63 UN missions/operations across 43 countries/regions. Currently, 4,212 Bangladeshi peacekeepers are actively engaged in 10 ongoing missions/assignments worldwide. The participation of women peacekeepers for global peace is gradually increasing. Meanwhile, 3,905 women peacekeepers have successfully completed their mission and currently 294 women peacekeepers are deployed in various peacekeeping operations. Till today, 175 Bangladeshi brave and valiant peacekeepers have laid down their lives and 287 peacekeepers suffered major injuries for the greater cause of world peace. In observing the International Day of United Nations Peacekeepers-2026, let us pay our deep respect and homage to the supreme sacrifice made by these brave sons. Their sacrifice has brightened the country's image in the world. Bangladesh resolutely reiterates her firm commitment always to undertake any UN assignment for global peace and stability.
